

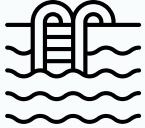
Emergency plan in a drought situation for the municipality of Begur

ALERT MEASURES



MAXIMUM VOLUME OF WATER PER INHABITANT PER DAY

The volumes delivered for population supply can be at most a maximum equivalent allocation of **172.5 liters per inhabitant per day**, including fractions served from municipal resources.



SWIMMING POOLS

- Any pool that does not have a water recirculation system cannot be filled or refilled.
- All swimming pools (public or private, with collective or individual access) can be partially refilled as long as they have water recirculation systems, but only in the essential quantities to guarantee the sanitary quality of the water, to replenish water losses due to evaporation and filter cleaning.
- The first filling of pools that have been newly built and those that have undergone renovation or modification of the vessel can be done.
- In educational centres, removable pools of less than 500 litres intended for children's swimming can be filled completely or partially.
- The filling and refilling of the swimming pools of youth facilities registered in the Register of Youth Facilities of the General Directorate of Youth is allowed.
- The filling and refilling of pools for therapeutic use located in hospitals and special education centres and pools intended for the bathing of people with disabilities that it is stated that they suffer from behavioural disturbances are allowed.
- These limitations do not apply to seawater pools that are filled and emptied without connection to public water supply and sanitation networks.

IRRIGATION – Green areas and public and private gardens

- Irrigation of gardens and green areas must be done only during the hours of less insolation (from 8pm to 8am). · The provision for irrigation must be the minimum indispensable adapting at all times to the conditions of temperature and humidity. Avoid watering during periods of rain. In any case, a volume of 450 m³/hectare/month cannot be exceeded.
- Private gardens can be watered a maximum of two days each week.





ORNAMENTAL SOURCES

- The total or partial filling of ornamental fountains, artificial lakes and other elements of aesthetic use of water is prohibited, except for artificial lakes that provide vital support for aquatic life, where the minimum use of water is allowed essential for its maintenance; it is also possible to assess the transfer of the affected aquatic life to other environments that ensure maximum survival with minimum water consumption.



CLEANING of vehicles

- Cleaning in commercial establishments dedicated to this activity that have water recirculation systems.
- Besides commercial establishments, glass-cleaning, mirrors, rearview mirrors, lights and licence plates are only permitted using a sponge and bucket.
- The cleaning of vehicles besides commercial establishments is also allowed if it is necessary to maintain the safety and health of people and animals. This category includes food transport vehicles, animal transport (alive or dead), ambulances, medical vehicles and medicine transport, as well as dump trucks. In any case, cleaning will be done with the minimum possible water use.



CLEANING of streets and urban furniture

- Individuals are prohibited from cleaning streets, pavements, facades and using water hoses. The ban does not include cleaning with a mop, bucket and sponge or high-pressure cleaning systems.
- The municipal services must carry out the cleaning with the minimum expenditure of indispensable water and prioritising, when possible, the use of regenerated water or water that does not come from the potable water supply network.

FARMS

- The use of water from the drinking water supply network is limited to the amounts needed for watering and cleaning the animals, as well as for cleaning the premises. For this last use, it is necessary to use only the quantities essential to maintain sanitary conditions and only in the event that an alternative source is not available and exclusively through pressure cleaning systems or others of equivalent effectiveness.



DUST IN THE AIR

Using water for dust removal and suspended matter in the air is prohibited.
